

Agreeing with New Testament Prayers (Col. 1:9-12)

I. PURPOSE & GOALS

- A. Developing heart language and Biblical reference for personal prayer using Apostolic Prayers.
- B. Become familiar with God's plans and promises for the New Testament Church

II. ASSIGNMENT

- A. Write a summary of the prayers in the space provided. Example verse and summary example:

Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Rom. 15:13)

- 1. Paul is praying to the Father that the believers in the church at Rome would overflow with hope. A hope that is supernatural, not a hope that is attained by human dedication but one that is given by the experiential power of the Holy Spirit. The Holy Spirit gives to Paul the means by which the human heart is filled with hope.
- 2. First Paul points to the "God of hope." Paul wants the believers in Rome to be filled with hope by looking/gazing at a God who has hope because whatever we behold in God's heart becomes a part of ours.
- 3. Second, under the influence of the Holy Spirit, Paul prays for their hearts to be filled with two specific things: "joy in believing" and "peace in believing."
- 4. When these two things are brought together by the power of the Holy Spirit something dynamic happens in the human heart - it begins to rest in the assurance of supernatural hope.
- 5. In essence, the Holy Spirit shows us that hope is the product of joy and peace being brought together in the heart, as we believe what God says about Himself and about us

III. PRACTICAL WORK

- A. Each individual will write out a minimum of 1 scriptural cross-reference and 5 "phrases of your own heart language" under each phrase, rewording/paraphrasing the phrase.
- B. Memorization; Please set yourself to memorize these sections of scripture. This is vital not just to the function of our idea of the House of Prayer, but they are also key to us knowing how to pray over ourselves. Take each month and focus on the selected section of Scripture. It is not that much to memorize.
- C. I would suggest reading it as a prayer for yourself two times a day
- D. Scriptures to use:

- 1. ***Ephesians 1:17-19***

2. *Ephesians 3:16-19*
3. *2 Thessalonians 3:1-5*
4. *Colossians 1:9-11*
5. *Philippians 1:9-11*

IV. FINAL THOUGHTS AND ADDITIONAL SCRIPTURES

- A. It is important to understand scriptures describing God causing His word to increase resulting in many being born again. God glorifies His Word by manifesting His power to confirm it with signs and wonders. (*Acts 4:29-31*)
- B. *Now when the Gentiles heard this, they were glad and glorified the word of the Lord and as many as had been appointed to eternal life believed. (Acts 13:48)*
- C. *So the Word of the Lord grew mightily and prevailed. (Acts 19:20)*
- D. *The Word of God spread, and the number of the disciples multiplied greatly (Acts 6:7)*
- E. *But the Word of God grew and multiplied (Acts 12:24)*
- F. *Then the proconsul believed...being astonished at the Teaching of the Lord. (Acts 13:12)*

V. VERSE FOR EXERCISE (COL. 1:9-12)

WE DO NOT CEASE TO PRAY FOR YOU, AND TO ASK THAT YOU MAY BE FILLED WITH THE KNOWLEDGE OF HIS WILL IN ALL WISDOM AND SPIRITUAL UNDERSTANDING; THAT YOU MAY WALK WORTHY OF THE LORD, BEING FRUITFUL IN EVERY GOOD WORK AND INCREASING IN THE KNOWLEDGE OF GOD; STRENGTHENED WITH ALL MIGHT, ACCORDING TO HIS GLORIOUS POWER, FOR ALL PATIENCE WITH LONGSUFFERING WITH JOY; GIVING THANKS TO THE FATHER WHO HAS QUALIFIED US TO BE PARTAKERS IN THE INHERITANCE OF THE SAINTS IN THE LIGHT. (COL. 1:9-12)
